The City's Section 3 office was recognized with a Spotlight Acknowledgment from the Alliance for Economic Inclusion (AEI). The Spotlight Acknowledgement was given at a special AEI meeting and luncheon in mid-December at the Kauffman Foundation Conference Center.

Kansas City's Section 3 office was recognized for their efforts to help low-income families through the Section 3 Program and, more specifically, on the East Campus project.

The Section 3 Office, located in the Historic Lincoln Building in the 18th and Vine District, serves to regulate the City's federal requirements related to the Section 3 HUD Act of 1968. The Section 3 Office certifies businesses and individuals as Section 3 Business Enterprises or Section 3 Workers. In addition, the City, in partnership
